June Triduum - 17th to 19th - theme this year: Christ yesterday,

today and forever - praying in today's world. Concluding with Garden Party on the Saturday evening. Thursday evening theme - praying for healing. Healing is a complex matter!Â Jesus sometimes responded to great need with instantaneous healing, but in other situations, Jesus' teaching and healing action took place over a period of time.Â Some people heal quickly; others take more time.Â Healing is greatly affected by the depth of hurt and pain from which one is trying to recover.Â The same is true regarding the great range of reactions experienced by individuals experiencing any kind of relationship breakdown.Â Thursday evening may help your healing process and encourage you to move on to a renewed faith and increased spiritual vitality.
