Be merciful to me, a sinner

Deep down we like to praise ourselves, and even though we don't say it aloud don't we sometimes feel we're better than others?

We can list for God our pilgrimages and fasts, our holy hours and prayer, our help to the poor, and almost want to be praised.

In itself, is that wrong? Hardly - but it becomes dangerous when we look down on others.

That's the story today the Pharisee was not a bad man,
for he lived a good life
but his fault was
that he looked down on others.

To be at rights with God is to know that each of us depends on God for so much in life, that our faith and religion are gifts, that our good works and prayer are gifts, our desire to help the poor is a gift, and that we should be grateful rather than boastful.

We thank God and others for what we have and are, rather than for what we do.

In each of us is the humility of the tax gatherer, and the knowledge that evil finds a home at times in each heart the evil word and thought, the evil intention and desire, the ways we'd like to get even with others; and, there is the willingness to say, as did the tax gatherer, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner,' and know then that we are at rights with God. For in the eyes of God we are, each of us, sinners who are immensely loved.
