You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church

`He must be joking', the others thought when Jesus said,`You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church'. They knew him well. A rather mediocre fisherman, a hot-tempered husband and father, the centre of everything going on, but could you rely on him?

They wouldn't be surprised later that he would deny that he knew Jesus, or that he would run away when the going was tough.

What they didn't think of was that they would all run away as well! Â Jesus saw into Peter's heart, recognised his generosity,

his enthusiasm for a cause, his love for family and friends, and named him `Rock'.
