## Fifth Station - Simon of Cyrene Helps Jesus to Carry His Cross

V: We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You. Â Â Adoremus te, Christe, et benedicimus tibi.

V: Consider how weak and weary Jesus was. At each step He was at the point of expiring. Fearing that He would die on the way when they wished Him to die the infamous death of the cross, they forced Simon of Cyrene to help carry the cross of Our Lord.

- Â Â Grant that I may love You always; and then do with me as You will.
