Thinking God's way

Jesus died at the hands of violent people and his disciples would have spared him  
or told him to live in such a way that  
no harm would come to him.

But God's way was the way of love,  
the type of love that is proved in  
hardship,  
the type of love that is understood only  
in God.

Illness for many years  
may seem like a waste to some;  
but we also see that within the illness

was a strength that was life-giving to many,  
and through it a deep love and faith was born,  
even in times of hardship and
